Community Consultation

Due to COVID-19 restrictions the Board agreed to undertake consultation to inform the strategic priorities of the Dorset Community House via a survey.

A survey was created on Google Forms on the 8th of September and a print version was also made. The surveys were promoted via our Facebook page, through our newsletter and membership data bases (207 individuals) and people visiting the House were asked to complete.

We closed the survey on Thursday the 17th of September with a prize draw of a \$50 master card that was offered to someone who filled out the survey. This was drawn live on our Facebook page. The prize has been shared with a very grateful winner.

A total of 66 surveys were completed – 51 online and 15 paper.

The Board of the Community House discussed the results of the survey at their meeting on the 29th of September 2020. The Board has decided that the two priority areas for our work this year will be 'Outreach to towns outside Scottsdale and Bridport' and 'Activities and Services for Young People.' This will not impact on any of the great services that the House already offers to the Community. We will just be putting some fresh energy and enthusiasm into these initiatives.
